Week 2 Devotion: God's View of Marriage



Denise and I have been in pastoral ministry for 35 years, and during that time

I have had the privilege of officiating some 30+ weddings. Most of the time Denise and I have

worked together with her coordinating the wedding rehearsals and then making sure the wedding party enters the Sanctuary properly at the ceremony itself. It has been one of the most enjoyable experiences of our ministry together.

That is because most weddings are filled with excitement and joy. Then, after the honeymoon comes the challenge – building a biblically healthy marriage. The newlywed couple will spend a lifetime together, building their relationship with God and each other.

As I prepare for a wedding rehearsal, I often think about Genesis 2 and the fact that God Himself officiated over the first wedding ceremony, and the honor it is to have that privilege. We are not told much about that moment except that God brought Eve to Adam. But God did far more than officiate over a wedding. He also designed the marriage. We see the foundation of that design in Genesis 2:18-25.

- The word 'helper' in verse 18 means one who brings completion to another. A husband and wife are gifts to one another, used by God to make us more together than we can be by ourselves.
- Then the word 'fit for' means to complement or fit together. Think of two gears that mesh together. I think this refers to the gender distinctions that make us uniquely male and female. If we are not careful, these distinctions can cause conflict in a marriage. God's intention is that they complement each other.
- Then there is 'hold fast' in verse 24. This means to be 'glued together', like two pieces of wood glued together to make one. Marriage is to be permanent – we are to be totally committed to one another.
- Finally we see that they are to 'become one flesh'. Though a husband and wife both maintain their individuality, they also are seen by God as one. They are now 'doing life' together.

God has designed marriage to be a man and woman coming together to share life as one through a committed, lifelong covenant relationship. Their unique gifts and personalities mesh together to bring completion, as they become more together than they would be separately. This relationship is sealed before and blessed by God, making this a sacred bond that brings glory to Him. Just as the Lord keeps His covenant promises to us, a husband and wife are committed to keeping their covenant promises to each other. As Jesus said, "So they are no longer two but one flesh. What therefore God has joined together, let not man separate." (Matthew 19:6).

The Bible is filled with commands and principles that help a husband and wife grow a God honoring and Christ reflecting marriage. One of the best places to find this wisdom is the book of Proverbs. Here are just a few areas of life that are addressed in this treasure trove of wisdom.

- The words we use with each other and resolving conflict – Prov. 10:18-21; 16:24; 12:18; 15:1; 15:4
- Our attitude towards and use of money – Prov. 11:28; 23:4-5; 22:9; 22:7; 21:20; 10:4
- Making prayerful plans for the future – Proverbs 13:16; 16:9; 27:23
- Our marriage relationship – Prov. 18:22; 19:14; 31:10; 24:3-4

Building a godly marriage, like building a godly life will not happen by accident. We bring an open heart that desires to grow in our love for God and each other to Him and His Word. The Holy Spirit then uses the Word of God to make us more like Christ. As a husband and wife do that together, the Lord creates a biblical marriage as they experience the covenant relationship He designed back in Eden.
